* DDC Board Meeting on <u>Thursday, May</u> <u>5, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.</u> The meeting is open to the Membership members may speak on a subject, but they may not vote. This will be a Zoom Meeting—look for an invitation one week prior.

A DDC Board Meeting was held on March 10. 2022 and the minutes from the January 6th Board meeting were approved as submitted. Due to the recent passing of George Parris, the Board elected Stan Vonasek to assume the Treasurer's position thru 2022. As of February 28th, the current balance of the treasury is \$9026.41. A more detailed Treasury report and Audit will be completed by May 5, 2022.

Our Pleasure Show will now be dedicated to the memory of George Parris and in his honor a Perpetual Trophy to the High Point Scorer will be awarded. As the Show continues to grow, so do the duties, hence Michele Brauning was appointed Co-Show Manager. Michele Brauning has evaluated the existing Club merchandise and made a proposal regarding adding a wider variety of items. Samples of these items will be available at the Annual Pleasure Driving Show and orders for the items will be taken.

As the Club continues to receive donations, a question arose as to the DDC's status with the IRS. The Club is in good standing, unfortunately the IRS is behind on updating its web site. Kim Baklarz will draft a letter thanking donors for their contributions to the DDC.

A General Membership Meeting was held on March 24, 2022 and the minutes from the December 11, 2021 were approved as submitted. Deposits of membership renewals, donations, show sponsorships and advertising resulted in a Treasury balance of \$10,005.72. A more detailed report will be available once the bank paperwork has been completed. With Stan stepping into the position of Treasurer, there is a vacancy for a Board Member. There were two options: 1) move ahead with a vacant position until the next election, or 2) try to find someone to fill the position and hold a mid-term election. It was decided to move ahead with a vacant position until the next election.

By-Laws Update: Currently the DDC by-laws call for the President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Secretary to serve one-year terms. During the General Membership meeting it was decided to change the terms of these offices as follows: extend the term to two years with terms staggered so only two officers are up for election each year. The initiation of this change will be determined by the Board at a future meeting. Also according to the current DDC by-laws, new members must be approved. This has not been done for many years and a change to the by-laws may be warranted. More discussion of this topic, as well as a planned review of the entire by-laws, will be taken up at the next DDC Board Meeting.

As Covid restrictions are finally lifting, the Club is now planning more 'face to face' activities. Frances Baker is planning a pleasure drive at her Hollyville Farm in Harbeson, DE on June 18 (rain date June 19th). There will be both short and longer driving routes available with a 'picnic' following the drive. More information will be in the May and June DDC newsletters. Diane and Rick Savage would like to invite members to their home, by the water, for a crab feast/fish fry in July. This may include a speaker and/or a mini tack swap/sale, but this is a non-horse event. Watch for particulars in upcoming DDC newsletters. Anna Klumpp is working with the owner of the truck scales in Kennedyville, MD to set a date for weighing carriages. The scales will give you the weight of your carriage within 20 lbs. Stan asked members for ideas on how best to handle this as there are A LOT of items. After much discussion and brainstorming of ideas, the best option seems to be an on-site auction. Stan will explore this further and keep DDC members informed.

Some clubs have been conducting informational driving clinics via Zoom. John Layton has compiled a list of topics and possible speakers. The subjects range from nutrition, commercial driving, turnout, harness fitting, gamblers' choice etc. This may be another idea to do in the heat of summer when it is too hot and buggy to do much driving.



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Mt Hermon Plow Day in Salisbury, MD

On April 2, 2022, the 15th Annual Mt. Hermon Plow Days was held at the Adkins Farm Market in Salisbury, Maryland. This event has grown from 150 people watching a few teams plow to having over 2400 people observing real horsepower at work. The purpose of Plow Days is to increase interest in the knowledge of how farm work was done with horses and mules in past years. Plowing is the highlighted work demonstration, with teams coming from many states. But the main goal is to create an appreciation for the contribution rural America made in the early days of our country. Besides trying your own hand at plowing, there were many live displays such as cooking on a woodstove and on an outdoor fire, making butter, gathering eggs, and quilting to name a few. This is always a great experience and many DDC Members enjoyed their day there. On Friday, April 1st over 600 Wicomico County, Maryland 4th grade students were able to enjoy and learn first hand about farm life at Mt. Hermon Plow Days. The students are studying this in their American History class and many were very impressed, but most stated they were glad they had indoor plumbing and were able to get their food from the grocery store!














Sunshine Corner

Managing Mud on Horse Farms

Drainage

Pile snow strategically and use **gutters**, **terrain** and **drainage ditches** to direct precipitation away from **buildings** and **paddocks**

High traffic pad construction:

1. Identify location and size

2. Excavate 8 inches of topsoil

3. Install drainpipe parallel to pad to aid

in water drainage (optional step)

4. First layer of geotextile fabric

5. Add 4 inch layer of **crushed limestone** (stones 1.5 to 1.75 inches) and compact

6. Second layer of geotextile fabric

7. Top with 4 inch layer of **dirty pea gravel** (with fines) and compact

8. Refresh top layer as needed



High traffic pads in heavy-use areas offer long-term drainage solutions if constructed and managed correctly

Alternative footing materials such as wood chips **are not** recommended due to **breakdown** and **maintenance needs**

> Create spots that are **"high and dry"** for **temporary** drainage solutions by adding gravel, dirt or sand

Remove **manure** and **soiled hay** daily as both will eventually become mud

Horse Health


Check horses daily for signs of ...

- Thrush: black tissue with a foul odor on the bottom of the hoof near the frog
- Cellulitis: warm, swollen and tender lower limbs
- Pastern dermatitis (aka Scratches): raw, irritated skin on the back of the pastern

Treatment:

- Remove horse from wet environment if possible
- Clean and dry daily
- Apply topicals
- Follow veterinary directions

Wet environments are breeding grounds for bacteria and to fungus
