Delmarva Driving Club Board of Directors'**April 2012 Meeting Minutes**

The minutes were accepted as published. The treasurer's report was accepted as printed.

At this date there were 4 entries for the May show and \$690 in sponsorships. For the Town and Country Class, Jane R would like to build a bridge out of marine plywood, with 2"x10" supports. The plywood would be covered with some kind of grit to prevent slipping hooves and it will be transportable to other venues. Up to \$300 was approved for expenses to add this to our collection of obstacles.

One CD was cleared and \$1000 put in the general checking account and the balance in a money market account where we can have access to it. This decision was made as the interest on the CD's was no longer worth leaving the money where it couldn't be used to promote the goals of the club. The larger CD will come to maturity in 2013 when a separate decision will be made about what to do with it. The board approved the distribution of the funds.

In a review of the events of the previous month, the C&D canal drive was a great success with 13 combinations heading out. Sherry H made certain the liability forms were signed. Many photos were taken and some will be in the next newsletter. Marti Bolinski will be asked to load the rest of the photos into a public album. Anna Klumpp's continuous drive attracted her largest number of entries, though several didn't actually make it to the event. Again a well organized and successful event. The Fun Bunny drive at Tuckahoe Equestrian Center drew an equal number of riders and drivers and everyone enjoyed the companionship. We were asked to consider the event again next year. There have been no responses to the Youth Clinic but we will promote

it again in the next newsletter.

The picnic and tour of the Nutter Marvel museum in August will be promoted in the newsletter and there will be handouts at the May show. It will be opened to other clubs and the public but reservations are a must as the women's auxiliary will be preparing lunches for the attendees.

The next board meeting will be on May 4 during the set-up time for the show. Members are invited to help with set up starting at 9AM and participate in the board meeting.

New members were approved. Pao Lin will place a link on the front page of the DDC website for joining as some people have expressed concern at not being able to find the link. A question was raised about the by-laws which require 1/10th of the membership to create a quorum for meetings. Further research showed that that amount is for the general membership meetings and doesn't affect the work of the BOD.

Insurance Question

Recently, the DDC Board of Directors had a discussion of liability. We wondered if the liability insurance currently held by the club would cover members, guests of members, general public and or the Board of Directors and what would the rate be?

Jackie' (our Treasurer) asked: "Would the rate be the same if the member invited and sponsored a guest at a DDC drive. Also, if a drive were to be open to the public – What would the quote for the price of that addition be?"

The Insurance company's answer:

"The club (DDC) currently has participant liability, which means both the club members and any non-member individual who participates in the club's events are insured for their liability during this event. The rate of \$33.48 (per additional event added to the schedule) included the participant liability coverage; it will not change if the event is open to the public."

Safe Driving Column by Martha MacDonald

Reining In

Those of us who drive regularly, fall into a rhythm, a series of well developed habits of safely hitching our horses. We remember the sequence of what is attached first, safely attaching reins before putting to, etc. But do we look at each piece of our harness as we go, especially those bits that connect the horse to the cart and the reins to the driver?

Picture this true story. A driver is happily hitched and driving down the road when suddenly the driver finds one rein floating loose in hand....the stitching or the buckle

has failed and the rein has fallen from the bit.

There the driver is....heading down the road with only one rein to control the horse.

This is a disaster waiting to happen. What to do?

Hopefully your horse is voice trained to halt. If you do nothing else this year, teach your horse to halt at the word WHOA. Halt means stop all forward motion, stand quietly. Practice, practice, practice until your horse will halt without the rein aids. Meanwhile, check all the stitching and buckles on your harness. If you

have beta harness this problem is less likely but not impossible. If, like me, you like the feel of leather reins, care for them, check the stitching and the condition of the buckles EVERY time you hitch up. One moment of inattention can lead you to the same heart stopping moment of my story. A minute or two of close attention to details can save you from a life threatening situation.

Mt. Herman Plow Days by Emma West

Amid the backdrop of teams of work horses and the farm implements of yesteryear, a group of elder farmers gathered before the crowd at Mt. Hermon Plow Days for recognition. Dubbed a celebration of "Honored Farmers," the midday ceremony brought together farmers from all over Delmarva and some from across the Chesapeake Bay who had begun farming when horses were the only horsepower on the farm and kept on farming through all the modern changes.

"The men before us are bridge builders," Oren Perdue, president of Mt. Hermon Plow Days, told the crowd. "They built a lot of bridges for us. They built the bridges with no tractors and no electricity." The criteria for being an honored farmer was simple: Seventy-five years old or older, and still farming or keeping a garden. More than 50 such farmers came out to the Plow Days on April 7 at Adkins Farm Market outside Salisbury, MD, along with about 2,100 other attendees to see teams of horses, mules and oxen go to work. DDC members in attendance included the West family, the Langfords, the Wilkins, the Conners, the

Bolinskis and the Evans, and all took an active part in the proceedings.

The Wests, the Langfords, the Wilkins and the Conners all participated in the plowing demonstration with their horses, plowing all through the morning and into the afternoon along with 15 other teams. Many acres of ground were turned that day before an attentive public, all of whom were excited to witness the experience of true horsepower at its finest. Many of the spectators had attended Plow Days in years past, and many of them enjoyed the experience so much that they return to the event year after year. Many of the people who attended plow day have never seen real horses before, let alone watched them work in harness as they did in years of old. In an age of enormous machines, tractors and high-tech farming gadgets, most people cannot even imagine what it would be like to work a field with nothing more than a piece of iron and two large drafts. It is a fascinating and wonderful experience for them, one they are extremely eager to experience for themselves.

In fact, there was such an interest in and demand for

this experience that the coordinators of Plow Days introduced Guest Plowing, giving attendees the opportunity to try farm work for themselves. The West family and the Conners, along with other teamsters, volunteered both their horses and their own plowing expertise to instruct and assist the participants as they took the plow handles and went a couple rounds themselves. The participants soon found out that it was harder than it looked, and left the furrow with a new respect for their farming forefathers. Yet it also gave them a glimpse of the simplicity, harmony and contentment that can be found in old-fashioned work and a partnership with nature. Most said it was something they would never forget, and for many it is a highlight they will cherish forever. From toddlers who had never seen farming done with anything other than the tractor to the honored farmers who started out their careers behind a team of horses, Plow Days spanned the generations and allowed everyone a chance to experience the tradition of farm life, the heritage from which America is built.





Pansy does want the membership to know that she and Joe cherish the years spent with the DDC and participating at our various events and






