

#### Percheron Hitch Joins the Army

Retirement faces all of us, including our horses. However, some retirees have a better, easier and more satisfying time than others. To wit: The famous eight black Percheron hitch, formerly owned by the Heinz Co. and based in Pittsburgh, was recently donated to the 3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment (The Old Guard) at Arlington National Cemetery. The horses, valued at more than \$100,000, will join a stable of more than 50 horses and will be used to pay homage to fallen soldiers in funeral processions of six-horse teams pulling a flag-draped coffin on a caisson at Arlington National Cemetery. There are an average of eight such ceremonies daily.

This special retirement offers enviable advantages: a full-time caretaker, veterinarian, and Michael Mullin, director of global corporate affairs for Heinz has the assurance that they will be well cared for the rest of their lives at Fort Myers ,VA. As the Heinz Hitch, they were a crowd favorite at such famous events as Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade and the Rose Bowl parade at Pasadena, Baseball's Opening Day for the Pirates as well as being showcased at expositions and fairs in Canada and across the United States.

According to original owner of the hitch operation, John Dryer, who was a former Heinz employee, his family had stabled the horses on his Washington County, PA farm for more than 15 years. The horses enjoyed a bushel of carrots just prior to their departure from the farm in August. Everyone agreed the team couldn't have a better new home.

#### **Preventing White Line Disease**

Careful management of equine stables and the picking of the hooves on a daily basis will reduce the incidence of fungal infections of the hoof responsible for white line disease.

In humans, toenail fungus commonly affects the traumatically stressed toes of runners, and the treatment is focused on the fungal infection rather than the mechanical stresses produced by running. Because a horse depends on the integrity of the hoof wall to stand or move, the focus here is prevention.

Hot seating horseshoes in the application process will eliminate the fungi between the hoof and shoe, thus decreasing the risk of transporting fungal spores into the hoof wall with the horseshoe nail.

The application of shoes on hooves with avulsions or cracks will help protect the affected area by preventing a buildup of debris.

Reducing the use of hoof pours or urethane packing (which create an environment conducive to fungal growth) will reduce fungal activity. Properly placed shoes will protect the hooves from the breaks and splits that provide access for fungal spores.

Soaking laminitic or abscessed feet with chlorine dioxide will prevent serious fungal infections. The use of iodine on the sole will reduce fungal populations. Fungi can consume the insensitive sole, leaving little or no natural protection.

Using a hoof antiseptic with providine iodine will likewise protect the hoof from serious fungal lesions. Activity and movement of the horse improves circulation and the body's defense against fungal and bacterial infections.
