



This idea is a great space saver and unique way to utilize plastic buckets/tubs for hanging your harness and storing related items. You can even use tin cans for bridle holders. However it doesn't work as well for western saddles and certain full horse collars. Food grade white buckets and their lids work particularly well since you can drill a hole in the edge of each bucket and lid and tie a piece of baling twine to each. This allows you to store your harness saddles and breast collars on top of the bucket and pads, gloves, etc. inside of each bucket. This keeps the items inside of the bucket together, clean, and vermin free. Since the lid is attached to the bucket, it won't get easily lost. To attach the buckets to the wall use can use wood in the bottom of the bucket to increase the strength. You can also use wall anchors.


