





Let's Drive!

From the ADS President (Dan Rosenthal) to ADS Members:

We are starting to see some early relaxation of the rules that have been put in place to keep our families and neighbors safe but we simply don't know what that will bring or how the states and local governments will individually respond to what happens next. Our Board and Technical Committees have stayed in close contact and watch the changing environment with the never lessening hope that soon we will be able to find a way to engage with each other in the sport we love and then at some near term point — to actually be able to resume having competitions, group events and club activities and just go out and drive with our friends. I have been engaged in conversations with organizers, competitors and recreational drivers as well as with those who regulate the upper levels of competition at the FEI and USEF. We are looking at changes in how events would be run and how organizers can have the legal and insurance protection that they need in order to open their homes to other drivers and yet keep their own families safe. I am personally engaged



with our insurance carriers to try to sort out how insurance and waivers might work in our new world. Some ideas are beginning to emerge – especially with respect to smaller single day events. Your Executive Committee, working with the Technical Committees and with the amazing supportive energy of our Executive Director Abbie Trexler has put together a survey that is being distributed. Our goal is to find out what you are thinking and expecting as well as to solicit your input on how we can and should move forward. I encourage you to complete the survey and provide your ideas – the information we get from this will help us chart a way forward for the sport of driving.

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DIY Corner




What do you do with the ends of your reins when driving? I often cringe when I see people with them dragging down at their feet or outside of the carriage. This can become a safety hazard as they could get caught in your wheels or part of the horse or vehicle or on something outside the vehicle and cause an accident. Some people hang the excess over their arm, but they don't always stay put.

Here are a couple of small driving "hacks" that are easy and may help others. The first is a stretchy band that loops over the wrist to hold reins up and off the floor of the vehicle while driving. It will break easily or come off quickly in case of accident. The second is a method that Anna Klumpp has shared—simply use the strap of your driving glove, place the rein underneath and Velcro it closed.

Tired of hay waste? Make a simple and easy to use slow feeder with a barrel, hay net, and 4 x 4 posts. There are many variations - make it to fit the needs of your equines! There are also commercial made products like a hay hoop
