DDC Board Meeting on Thursday, November 4, 2021 at 7:30 pm. The meeting is open to the Membership—members may speak on a subject, but they may not vote. Meetings will now be held via Zoom and an invitation will be sent via email 1 week prior to the meeting.

A General Membership Meeting was held on Sunday, September 26, 2021 in conjunction with the Delaware Equine Council's Membership Appreciation Ride and Drive Event at Redden Forest. Minutes of the last General Membership meeting, held on November 5, 2020, were approved as sent out. As of 9/26/21, the treasury had a beginning balance of \$8,515.41. Expenses were \$751.18 (\$575.59 was for insurance) giving an ending balance of \$7,764.23 The report was accepted as presented. The Show Committee reported that the May 2021 Show had a profit of \$1,200 with 27 entries. This was the most successful Show to date. The May, 2022 Show will be held on May 14th at the Wicomico Equestrian Center in Salisbury, Maryland. Show Chairman Pam Gray is in the process of

securing a Judge for the Show and has contacted Rebecca Merritt. The food vendor and port-apots have been already been contracted. As always, volunteers are needed both the day before the show and the day of the Show. Pam thanked all volunteers who make the 2021 show possible. It would not happen without the hard work of the volunteers. Please contact her if you would like to volunteer for the 2022 event.

Frances Baker reported that members have been very appreciative of the Sunshine Cards she has sent. Please continue to let her know of 'Sunshine needs'.

Once again it has been reported that a number of member's emails have been hacked. DO NOT send money or gift cards to other club members. This is not something that would ever be sanctioned by the club. It is a scam and is almost

impossible to make it stop (it is reported each time it occurs).

Michele Novack is gathering information from Maryland and surrounding states concerning what organizations and networks are in place for the rescue of horses and other large animals. 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Nominations for the 2022 DDC Board of Directors

Once again it is time for our year end Elections and Members Frances Baker and Diane Savage are chairing the Nominating Committee. Positions available are: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer (these positions serve a one year term), and five Board of Director positions (these positions serve a two year term). Listed below are the minimum duties of each office, however additional duties may be assigned.

- 1. President: Preside at all business meetings, voting only as a tie breaker. Set committee chairpersons, appoint nominating committee, and perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
- 2. Vice-President: Presides at business meetings in the absence of the President. In addition, shall perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
- 3. Secretary: Shall keep and preserve the minutes of all meetings of the Club, maintain an accurate and complete record of the membership roster (this responsibility may be delegated to a Membership Chairperson), respond to correspondence as directed and notify new members of their acceptance. An attendance record is to be kept for all meetings. In addition, is to perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
- 4. Treasurer: Is custodian of all monies of the Club, and handles the disbursement of funds with checks to be signed by the treasurer or other authorized board member. A verbal (or written) report is to be presented at each business meeting. An accurate written report of the financial condition of the Club shall be prepared quarterly for the April, July, October, and December meetings, and in preparation for turning over financial records to the incoming treasurer. In addition, is to perform all such duties as prescribed by the current Robert's Rules of Order, the parliamentary authority adopted by this Club.
- 5. Directors: Contribute to the leadership of the Club and may be requested to fill assorted responsibilities as set forth in Standing Rules, attached to this document.

Board meetings are held bimonthly via Zoom format and as needed to conduct business. The Club also tries to hold three General Membership meetings per year (February, September, and December). If you are interested in serving, contact the Nominating Committee or any Board Member. A Slate of Officers will be presented in the November Newsletter and be voted on in December. A decision regarding holding an inperson December general membership meeting will be further discussed at the November 4th Board Meeting. The method of voting will also be decided at that time. Look for the details in the November Newsletter or via Club email.

The Art of Coaching



Coaching has been defined as the art or sport of controlling and directing draft animals from a coach or other conveyance to which they are harnessed. This sport was inspired by the English mail runs of the 18th and 19th centuries and wealthy Englishmen and women began to take up coaching as both a social and leisure activity and a competitive sport. As coaching gained popularity, road coaches and drags, carriages similar to the mail coaches, became commonplace on the roadways. A road coach is a style of sporting carriage that is horsed and driven by its owner. Owner/drivers were responsible for the maintenance of his or her coach as well as stabling and caring for their horses. In addition to the ten passengers the coach could hold it also had accommodations at the rear for two footmen—paid staff along on the journey to assist passengers on and off of the coach as well as maintain the team of horses when the whip stepped away from the coach. Coaching was not limited to men. Women's clubs allowed

female whips to learn the skills necessary for driving a four-in-hand team. In the beginning, the coaching clubs merely drove their teams to races, but soon developed routes comparable to those in England for timed runs. Coaching also became a prominent feature of the summer social scene and coaching parades served as a closing ceremony of the social season in many areas. These parades were an opportunity for the drivers and passengers to display their coaches, teams, and finery to each other, while also providing a spectacle for onlookers. However coaching runs and parades came to an end in 1907, as the popularity of the automobile began to increase. However John Seabrook, who began collecting and driving l9th century carriages in 1939, was instrumental in reviving the sport of "coaching" in the U.S when the sporting world had almost forgotten about carriage driving. There has been a resurgence of Coaching or Four-in-Hand Clubs whose mission is to collect,

preserve, and perpetuate the history and traditions of coaching and the art of four-in-hand driving, as well as to promote the sport to its highest standards. DDC Member Frances Baker belongs to several Four-in-Hand Clubs and she recently attended the 21st Anniversary Meet of the Four-in-Hand Club in Middleburg, Virginia on September 3rd through September 5th. There were nineteen turnouts that participated in three organized drives throughout the beautiful countryside of Middleburg. DDC Members Wayne Baker, Linda


