Trot the Trails Event on August 19th!

DDC Members Frances and Wayne Baker's Hollyville Farm in Harbeson, DE was the site for the recent Trot the Trails Event. Besides the wonderful location, the beautiful weather was perfect for the participants from Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Ten entries navigated three different courses. There was a cones course designed to be easy enough for a novice, but still challenging for more experienced drivers, followed by a 6 kilometer (4 mile) pleasure drive through the wooded trails of the farm. The event ended with a Driving Derby which is very spectacular and now quite popular with both drivers and spectators. It can take place outside on a plot

provided for this purpose or inside an enclosure, like an arena. Driving derbies are a great way to have fun and ultimately are used as practice or 'tuning up' for combined driving events. The components of this event include a cones course (pairs of numbered cones with a ball set on the top) and two combined driving style obstacles. Both the cones and the gates within an obstacle have a red marker on the right and a white marker on the left thus indicating the correct direction to be driven. Competitors may be allowed to drive multiple rounds of the course, with each round scored separately. After the judge has blown the whistle, the competitor passes through the Start/Finish line, which starts their time. They then proceed through a series of numbered cones and then into the first obstacle, driving the lettered gates in alphabetical order and in the correct direction. Once the obstacle is complete the driver proceeds through another set of numbered cones and into the second obstacle again driving the lettered gates in order and in the correct direction. After the second obstacle, they proceed through the last set of numbered cones to the finish line where their time stops. Scores are determined by the time on course plus any course or other penalties (assessed in seconds). Placing is determined by the fastest time including time added for penalties. Derbies usually include different divisions to accommodate a variety of skill levels from rookie drivers (or horses) to those who are very experienced. The four divisions are Training, Preliminary, Intermediate and Advanced. The differences between the levels are the allowed gaits of the horse and the amount of compulsory lettered gates in the obstacles. Training level is only allowed to walk or trot, whereas the other levels allow the entries to canter on course. The number of compulsory gates in an obstacle changes for each division. Training has three gates labeled A through C, Preliminary A through D, Intermediate A through E, and Advanced A through F.

Ideally, marathon vehicles are driven for derbies, but traditional vehicles may also be used. Navigators are required for each entry (with a few exceptions). Navigators are allowed to communicate with the driver and give directions as to the route intended to be driven, but of equal importance, the navigator is a counter weight on the back of a marathon. In a derby, horses need to be sound but do not have to be as fit as they would be if they were competing in a combined driving marathon. Protective equipment for the horse such as splint boots, bell boots and harness padding is allowed. The driver and navigator are required to wear approved helmets and safety vests are strongly encouraged for adults and are mandatory for juniors. The attire of the driver and navigator is casual similar to what would be worn for the marathon portion of combined driving.

A driving derby is an excellent opportunity to gain experience for those who are new to combined driving as well as a "tune up" for seasoned entries. To add to the challenge of our Trot the Trails Driving Derby, awards were given for the best times for VSE, Pony, Horse, and Multiples (since many of our participants were new to the event)! Winners were: Kate Pantelione in the VSE Division, Stan Vonasek for the Pony Division, Ken Lehberger for the Horse Division, and George Clardy for Multiples. All the participants enjoyed this fun and educational event and are ready to try it again! Many thanks go to: Frances and Wayne Baker for planning and hosting the event and volunteers Kim Baklarz, Rich Graves, Ann Lioio, Sherry Harris, Mary Bashtarz, Linda Thomas, Brianne Reynolds, and Lane Reis. 

Helpful Hints!




It seems all equestrians have some kind of battle with keeping water troughs filled. Here's a helpful hack—place the end of your hose through a Jolly Ball—it keeps the hose from 'flying out' of the trough and you can see from a distance when the trough is full.

Tether your brushes to your water buckets.

If you are regularly filling your water buckets only to realize you left your brushes somewhere else, you can just run some baling twine/rope through holes on the rims of your buckets and attach the brushes directly. That way, they will always be there.

If you make up feed ahead of time, don't leave it in an open bucket/pan. Instead, cover it with a shower cap. That is enough to prevent flies from getting at the food. Supposedly it can deter rodents too, but rodents can chew through plastic pretty easily if they realize there is food under it.
