



Using Susie Buchanan's Famous Wheel Exercise

At the recent Buck a Ball and Cones driving Clinic, DDC Member Anna Klumpp presented and utilized Susie Buchanan's Wheel Exercise. Susie, who died in 2013, was well known in the driving world as an enthusiastic trainer and competitor. One of Susie's neatest innovations is what she referred to as "the wheel". Essentially it's an 8-spoke wagon wheel formation comprised of cones and cavaletti. This formation offers a great number of driving exercises to improve the suppleness, straightness, and bending of the horse. It's also instrumental in developing the driver's eyes and aids. What materials do you need: at least a 40 meter by 40 meter fairly level piece of ground, 24 cones or markers, and 8 pieces of ten foot long PVC pipes or jump rails. Then simply visualize a wheel with eight spokes—each spoke has a cone at each end. The outer end of each spoke is 15 meters from the hub of the wheel, so there is free space around the center marker of about six meters radius. Then place one more cone at the outer edge of each spoke—about two meters beyond, still in line with the spoke forming the rim of the wheel. But always remember to set your cones generously when first starting this exercise, so you don't get so frustrated as you learn. (see diagram) Now you're ready to benefit from this exercise. Start by following the lines of travel on the outside pairs of cones. What you will learn is to keep the outside rein, learn to look for a point of balance between the last and the next outside cone, keep your eyes ahead, (tweak the inside rein without giving away the outer). Once that part of the exercise becomes simple and successful, and equal on both reins, you can pick up your tempo. This exercise also helps you understand the meaning of 'half halt' - a call to attention - preparation it takes less to achieve more. Keep referring to the diagram to continue to add more challenges to the exercise circles! Build a logical progression by establishing patterns the horse can learn and understand—also be generous with encouragement and reward! - since for the most part we tend not to challenge our horses and/or ourselves nearly enough, particularly when working alone!!! Monitor Your Trailer Temperature

Get an inexpensive <u>indoor/outdoor thermometer</u> to keep tabs on the temperature inside your trailer (without pulling over every 10 min!). Put the outdoor portion in the trailer and keep the reader inside the cab of the truck. Great for piece of mind while travelling, especially during extreme weather.





Homemade Ice Packs


